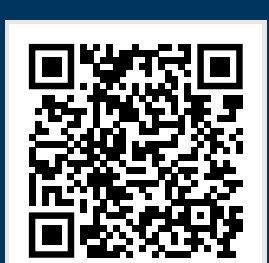


COMPLETE YOUR

REQUIREMENTS AND ATTEND THE CSU

- 1 The courses required to graduate from high school are not the same requirements to apply to the CSU.
- 2 Take the time to understand the A-G requirements. It's never too early to start planning your courses.
- 3 See your counselor to receive guidance on completing your A-G plan. Be sure to keep track of your A-G progress.
- 4 Improve your grades by talking to your teacher and seeking tutoring.
- 5 A-G courses will help you prepare for many paths after high school.
- 6 Learn about dual enrollment courses to earn college credit. This may save time and money while attending college.
- 7 Use the CaliforniaColleges.edu planning tool to track your A-G requirements.



A HISTORY AND SOCIAL SCIENCE

1 year of U.S. history or 1 semester of U.S. history and 1 semester of civics or American government AND 1 year of social science.



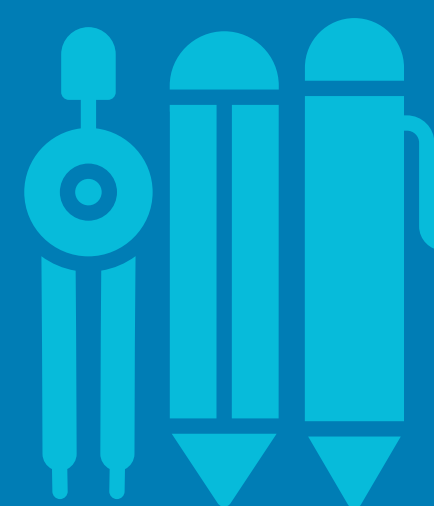
B ENGLISH

4 years of college preparatory English composition and literature.



C MATH

(4 years recommended) of college preparatory math including or integrating topics covered in algebra, geometry, and intermediate algebra.*



*Math courses completed in the 7th and/or 8th grade may be used to meet part of or all of the requirements.

D LABORATORY SCIENCE

2 years of college preparatory science required with laboratory (1 biological and 1 physical). Integrated science and interdisciplinary courses can meet this requirement.



E LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

2 years or through the second level of high school instruction in the same language; American Sign Language and classical languages such as Latin and Greek are acceptable.



F VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

1 year or 2 semester courses from the same discipline required including dance, music, theatre, visual arts or interdisciplinary arts.



G COLLEGE PREPARATORY ELECTIVE

Additional year chosen from the University of California "A-G" list.
